Rules for nomination of awards

Nominations

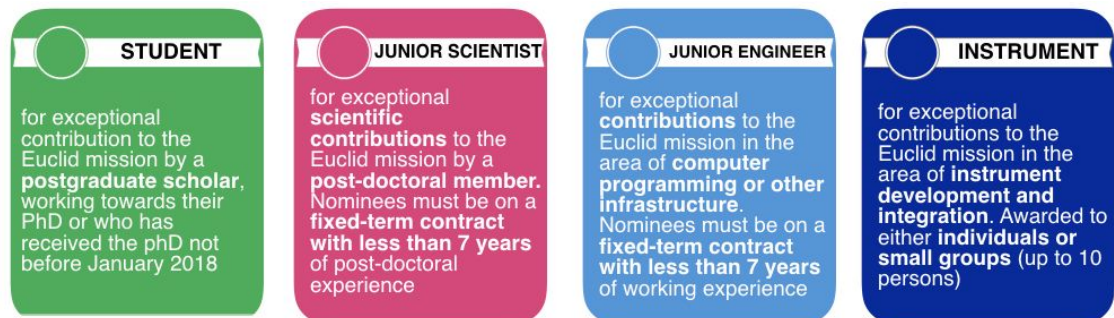
- Nominations for outstanding contributions to Euclid can be made by any member of the Euclid Consortium (EC): any EC member or group of members can nominate another EC member or EC team.
- Self-nominations and nominations by Euclid STAR Prize Committee Members are not allowed.
- Group nominations are allowed: different people wishing to nominate the same person can, if they wish, submit one common nomination signed by all group members.
- Copy/paste from other nominators is not recommended. If more people wish to nominate the same person, they can join into a group nomination.
- It is allowed to send more than one nomination also within the same category: either to support more than one person or to support the same person within an individual and/or 'group-nominations'. If a nominator supports more than one person or group within the same category (either as single nomination, or group nomination) s/he should motivate well why .
- Committee members are allowed to solicit specific nominations by other Euclid members, but should then declare a conflict of interest.
- The committee reserves the right to solicit coordinators for additional information on any nominated candidates to assist in deliberations.

Eligibility

- Any work done within the Euclid Consortium is eligible. Awards are assigned based on work done between January 2018 and December 2018.
- Only members of the EC can obtain a Euclid STAR Prize award.
- No member of the award committee is eligible to receive the Euclid STAR Prize. In the case of a team prize, the committee members are not eligible to receive the award (but the rest of the team is).
- The 'Science' and 'Infrastructure' Euclid STAR Prize Awards are reserved to early career fixed term (<6 years from PhD) EC members. Nominators are asked to indicate explicitly the career stage of the nominee.
- Students (including PhD) can be nominated only for the Student Euclid STAR Prize.

Selection Procedure

- An individual nominee may not receive more than one award in a given year.
- Decisions will be based on a consensus reached by the committee in closed discussions that will use the information submitted in the forms, and any additional information solicited from the coordinators.
- Criteria include: quality of the work described in the nominations and/or beneficial impact for the Euclid Consortium and/or variety of contributions to different groups in the Euclid Consortium.
- Specific criteria for each category are:

YEARLY PRIZE TO ACKNOWLEDGE WORK DONE WITHIN THE EUCLID CONSORTIUM



- **STUDENT:** for exceptional **contributions** to the Euclid mission by a **postgraduate scholar**. Awarded to someone who is working towards their

PhD, or who got the PhD not before January 2018. This award recognizes for an exceptional amount of high quality work for Euclid or a significant scientific contribution to Euclid's mission.

- JUNIOR SCIENTIST: for exceptional **scientific contributions** to the Euclid mission by a **post-doctoral member**, who has done an exceptional amount of high quality work. Nominees must be on a **fixed-term contract with less than 7 years** of post-doctoral experience
- JUNIOR ENGINEER: for exceptional **contributions** to the Euclid mission in the area of **instrument, computer programming or other infrastructure**. Nominees must be on a **fixed-term contract with less than 7 years of working** experience
- INSTRUMENT: for exceptional contributions to the Euclid mission in the area of **instrument development and integration**. Awarded to either **individuals or small groups** (up to 10 persons) who did a particularly significant work on instruments
- SENIOR: for exceptional **scientific or technical** contributions to Euclid by a senior scientist or engineer who has been pursuing scientific or technological work for **more than 7 years of post-doctoral experience**
- LEADERSHIP AND COORDINATION: for excellent **management of a task/team** by a Euclid member, with either fixed term or permanent contract, in any Euclid area.
- TEAM: for any **grouping (≥2) of people** who have made a significant **joint** contribution (e.g. efficient running of a working group, tiger teams, etc). The Team Prize shall be awarded when a significant team contribution is found by the committee and may therefore remain un-awarded some years.
- The committee will be under no obligation to disclose its private deliberations.
- The committee's decisions are final.
